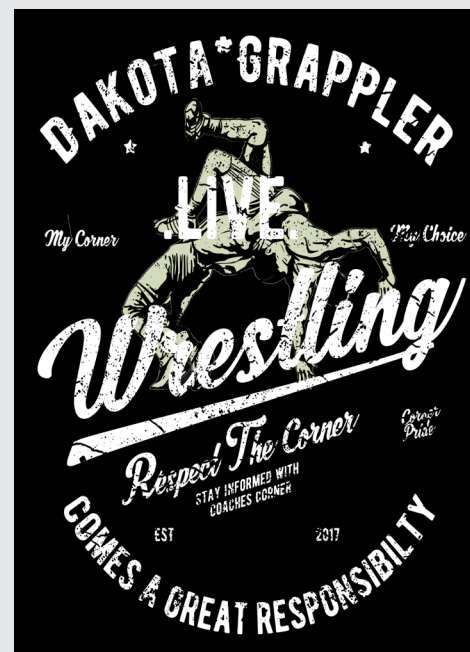

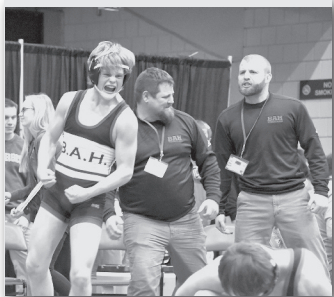

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Wrestling Coach Philosophy



A coaching philosophy is an essential ingredient of leadership. Strengthening leadership credibility starts with a coaching philosophy that makes clear the fundamental reason for coaching and the coach's core values.

Developing your coaching philosophy means identifying the purpose of your coaching, your coaching values and choosing your leadership style. Together, these three elements form your coaching philosophy.

So Let's break this down into three easy steps to start. Then make it a little more advanced. So, Step 1. What is your purpose: Decide which of the reasons for coaching — providing a positive sport experience for athletes, providing the opportunity for athletes to achieve their full potential through wrestling, and using sport as a holistic

means of individual development — is your priority. Not to get long winded but the purpose of coaching might be simple but underlying is a complex web of what is best for the athlete and not for the coach! Coaching is not merely a technique to be wheeled out and rigidly applied in certain prescribed situations. It is a way of leading, a way of treating people, a way of thinking, a way of being. The underlying and ever-present purpose of coaching is building the self-belief of others, regardless of the content the drills the moves you have taught your wrestlers or issue. If leaders and coaches bear this in mind and act on it persistently and authentically, they will be staggered by the improvements in relationships and in performance that result.

Whether we teach, coach, manage or lead, the effectiveness of what we do depends in large measure on our beliefs about human potential. The expressions "to get the best out of someone" and "your hidden potential" imply that more lies within the person waiting to be released. Unless the leader or coach believes that people possess more capability

than they are currently expressing, he or she will not be able to help them. They must think of people in terms of their potential, not their performance on the mat. The majority of appraisal systems are seriously flawed for this reason. People are put in performance boxes from which it is hard for them to escape, either in their own eyes or their coach's.

To get the best out of people, we have to believe the best is there – but how do we know it is, how much is there and how do we get it out? That might be the little secrets the best coaches have. The secret formula a wished I had. Build that culture.... Does begin with a so-

Second, is Leadership Style: Now, this could be the longest part of this article but I will save that for another day. I went to a coaching

class a long time ago that gave me a list of leadership styles, so I am looking through those notes and I will condense them for the readers. Pick your style, 1. Laissez Faire (french) for "hands off" style also known as delegative leadership, is a type of leadership style in which leaders allow group members to make the decisions. Some people really struggle with this style because it takes complete trust in other leaders on the team to do their job, and that does not always happen.

2. Pace-Setter: this leadership style is one that sets the bar high and expects work to be done fast and right. This is perfect for those high energy wrestling coaches who know what they are doing and are driven to success. Downside is usually high stress and high burnout.

3. Autocratic Leadership: this style is one person in control of everything. This coach makes the decision and that is final. Very little input from others is taken in the final decision making. Practices would be highly structured and very rigid, and rules are clearly outlined. Pros usually for this style include clear oversight of what need to take place,

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and tough decisions need to be made. Drawbacks would include group input, assistant coach turnover, new ideas and creative practices are sometimes lost.

4. Democratic Leadership: In this style the coach will listen to other stakeholders but will make the final decision. The leader still is very involved in day to day activities but will allow for more creative thinking to flourish. The downside of this style is when a decision has to be made right away. And sometimes these leaders get backstabbed without clear rules.

5. Servant Leadership: In this style, the leader is second to the assistant coaches. This model follows a people or idea first premise. The leader highlights the individual or the team as opposed to him or herself. This is one of the best styles for very small teams or new programs because the people are as important as the mission. Servant Leadership is also good to use when the team is suffering from low morale.

6. Transformational Leadership: Do you have a vision and share it with your team to get them excited

about your vision? Then you might be a transformational leader.

This leader is self-aware, authentic, empathetic and humble. These leaders want everyone to succeed and accomplish the shared vision.

And when people feel they are sharing in something great, they will make every effort to be the best and do the best work. This sounds great but it needs a full commitment out of all involved, and needs to be very organized or people see this as just a dream and not reality.

7. Transactional Leadership: Transactional Leadership is a reward/punishment model. For example, if one of your team members gets the most pins on a weekend he gets the weekly pin trophy.

On the other hand there is the punishment side such as if someone doesn't get the pin totals have sprints or push-ups.

This leadership style may inspire some to do better because something they want is on the line. Yet, this leadership may also lower morale because of the punishments.

And Finally 8. Charismatic Leadership: Charismatic Leadership is the leadership style that comes with a personality that people just love. These leaders inspire, motivate and energize the team.

The Center for Association Leadership says this style

may increase team morale and success. I know several coaches I would classify as this style at times. Like Jeff Schumacher he is a charismatic leader.

Of course, not everyone is born with natural charisma but you can learn to be motivational and inspiring, and you could become charismatic with a little effort over time.

It is in your best interest as a leader to learn about a variety of leadership styles. What may have worked ten years ago may not be as effective today. Not every situation will call for the same leadership style, and you need to stay flexible and informed to lead your wrestlers the right way.

If something is not working with your leadership style and you are changing, be aware that your people may take a little longer to accept your new style so be patient.

Also, being a leader is an ever evolving skill which takes knowing who you are, who your people are and what task needs to be done in and out of the wrestling room.

A good piece of wisdom is to be consistent with your leadership styles and situations.

What is really crazy is the best coaches never have to worry about this they have a natural ability to understand their surroundings. Also remember all coaches make mistakes and try lots of new ways to motivate their athletes.

To be the best leader you can, you need to grow and adjust your leadership styles for overall success.

Finally, a value system. This element to coaching philosophy requires that you be clear about what you want to do and how everyone must behave. You need to define what means are acceptable to you as a coach. Values are indispensable is you are to lead.

Values guide your conduct across the variety of coaching setting and situations. Values tell you what to do and what not to do and they help you identify the conflict in a situation. Values clarify our priorities and help us decide when to act and when not to act. Values give us energy to lead. I have found Fellowship of Christian Athletes a great organization that can help with those skills, check out their website. Values also motivate us and tell us what is most important. I found a great checklist while researching for this article and have got permission to reprint it from the NAIA.

- ☐ **BE RELIABLE:** Prove that others can depend on you.

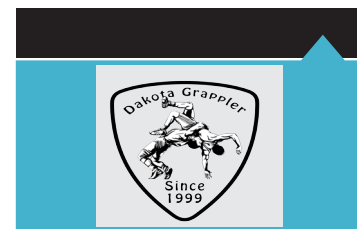
Sportsmanship: Bring your best to all competition.

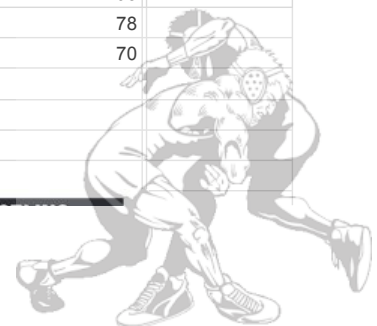
